IMPROVING SCHOOL CLIMATE IN PORTSMOUTH SCHOOLS



THE PROBLEMS

STUDENT SUSPENSIONS

Portsmouth ranks as sixth in the state for short-term school suspensions. In 2018, 16% of Portsmouth students were suspended, including many in elementary school. Students who are suspended or expelled are more likely to be in contact with the criminal justice system within a year of the forced leave.

TEACHER MORALE

In exit surveys, almost a third of Portsmouth teachers expressed that morale in their department was low and that the school environment was adverse to learning. Research has shown time and time again: morale matters. "When teachers feel good about their work, student achievement rises."

SOMETHING IS NOT WORKING.

These problems are interrelated; when teachers aren't supported, students cannot thrive. When students are suspended, they cannot learn.

We need to work together to improve our schools and communities.
